

# All are Welcome to Attend the Convention

### **Automatic Delegates**

Members of the National Executive Board are automatic delegates to the convention and are not counted against a union's allocation of delegates.

### **Constitutional Delegates**

Each chapter shall be entitled to be represented by one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each five (5) chapter members or a major fraction thereof.

Each union shall be entitled to be represented by one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each five (5) CLUW members belonging to that union or fraction thereof.

### **CLUW Members who are not delegates**

Members are invited to attend and participate in their union's caucus meetings and attend all activities of the convention.

### **Guests and Supporters**

Also are encouraged to attend all convention activities.

### How will delegates be seated?

Seating on the convention floor by delegation will be decided by drawing lots.

## Important 2001 Convention Cut-Off Dates

### July 4

You must be a regular member in good standing by this date in order to run for Convention union or chapter delegate/alternate.

### July 4

The number of Convention delegates and alternates a union or chapter is entitled to will be determined as of membership counts on this date.

### July 4

Union Delegate/Alternate Candidate Forms are due back to your Union Coordinator postmarked no later than this date. (See last page for a list of Union Coordinators).

### August 4

Elections of union and chapter delegates/alternates must be held no later than this date.

Convention resolutions and amendments to the constitution must be postmarked and sent to the CLUW National Office by this date.

You must be a regular member in good standing by this date to run or vote for the 2001-2003 National Executive Board

### September 4

The number of delegates/alternates a union is entitled to elect to the 2001-2003 National Executive Board will be determined by membership counts on this date.

### **September 11**

Hotel reservation cut-off date.

Signed Convention Delegate/Alternate Credentials are due back to the CLUW National Office.

Convention Registration Forms are due back to the CLUW Treasurer.

The registration fee covers attendance to the convention, admission to the New Technology Conference, a ticket to the Gala Reception, a Convention Kit, educational materials and workshops (to be announced).

This is not a delegate credential form. This form only registers you to attend the convention. Delegate credential forms will be mailed to all elected delegates after September 11, 2001. However, you are encouraged to register for the convention prior to the outcome of the delegates selection process.

### Rules

### **General Rules**

- To be seated at the Convention, an elected delegate must be a CLUW member in good standing (dues paid by July 4,
- No funds, official publications, office stationary, machines or supplies of CLUW, or any subordinate bodies, may be used to support or advocate a candidate for delegate or alternate.
- In the event a delegate is disqualified or unable to participate, that delegate's place shall be taken by the selected alternate who has received the highest number of votes as reported in the union or chapter election. Where no election is necessary, union alternates shall be ranked by the union involved in the Convention.

### **Eligibility**

The number of delegates and alternates a union is entitled to shall be determined by the membership count on July 4, 2001. NEB members — including officers, union delegates and alternates, chapter delegates and alternates, and chapter presidents shall be automatic Convention delegates and need not run for election. NEB members will not be counted against the number of delegates a union or chapter is entitled to.

### **Nominations - Union**

- A member may not run for, or hold, more than one convention position. Members nominated for more than one position will be ruled ineligible.
- To become a candidate for delegate or alternate from your union, individuals must submit a candidate form.
- All nominations must be submitted on Candidate Forms provided by the National Elections Committee available through the CLUW News Convention Call, the CLUW National Office, and your Union Coordinator.
- Candidate forms must be postmarked no later than midnight, July 4, 2001 and returned to your Union Election Coordinator or the National Office for validation. All candidate forms postmarked after July 4, 2001 will be voided.

### **Elections - Union**

- Elections for union convention delegates must be completed no later than August 4, 2001. Elections shall be conducted by a Union Election Coordinator appointed by the CLUW National President. The union election coordinator shall have the general responsibility for the conduct of the election in accordance with procedures outlined herein.
- Each union shall be entitled to be represented by one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each five (5) CLUW members belonging to that union or fraction thereof.
- All members in good standing must be afforded a reasonable opportunity to vote. There shall be no proxy voting. Elections shall be by secret ballot unless there is no contest. If more than one person is nominated for a single position, the winner must receive the majority of the votes cast. If no candidate receives the majority, the runoff election will be conducted between the two candidates with the highest number of votes.

### **Nominations - Chapter**

Nominations for chapter delegates may be held in conjunction with the delegate elections in chapter meetings. Nominations may be made from the floor. Written notice of the election shall be given thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting to all chapter members in good standing.

### **Elections - Chapter**

- 1. Chapter Delegate elections shall be conducted by a chapter-selected election committee which shall have general responsibility for conducting an election in accordance with the procedures herein. All chapter elections for conventions delegates and alternates must be held no later than August 4, 2001.
- Each chapter shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each five (5) chapter members or a major fraction thereof.

### **Verification of Union/Chapter Elections**

The names and addresses of the duly elected union and chapter delegates and alternates shall be forwarded by mail by union election coordinators and chapter election chairs to the National CLUW Office no later than seven (7) days following the date of the election.

The National CLUW Office will mail the official credentials to the elected union and chapter delegates and alternates.

### **Appeals**

The National Elections Committee, which is appointed by the President, shall be responsible for receiving all protests and appeals from union and chapter elections. All appeals from elections must be made in writing and addressed to the National Elections Committee and received no later than September 4, 2001. Appeals to the decisions of the National Election Committee may be made to the convention.

If you have questions regarding these rules, please contact the National CLUW Office or your union election coordinator.

### **Convention Resolutions**

In accordance with the CLUW Constitution, resolutions must be received at the National Office by August 4, 2001.

Resolutions adopted/supported by CLUW Chapters must be signed by a CLUW Chapter Officer.

Resolutions should be based on the four goals of CLUW as set forth in the National CLUW Constitution.

The preferred format for resolutions is on a 3.5 inch computer disk in WordPerfect or Microsoft Word format.

All resolutions should list the member's name, union affiliation or chapter, be properly researched and submitted on a timely basis.

To avoid duplication of resolutions adopted at the 1997 and 1999 Conventions, we are providing a list of the resolution topics already passed on CLUW's website at www.cluw.org.
